

**Governor's Working Group on Veterans, Service Members, and their Families

Daniel Hoffmann is the director of VA's Mid-Atlantic Health Care Network, also known as VISN 6 (aka, Veterans Integrated Service Network). In this role, he leads the delivery of health care to more than 350,000 Veterans residing in North Carolina, Virginia, and a part of West Virginia. During his tenure as the network director, he has grown the organization from 10 sites of care to more than 40. During 2014, VISN 6 provided more than 4 million appointments. One of the top priorities for the VISN is to continue growing access.

Jim Swain is a Program Specialist with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services, NC Department of Health and Human Services. He has statewide responsibilities in program development and outreach for consumers with intellectual and developmental disabilities and brain injuries. Mr. Swain holds Master's Degrees in Counseling and Rehabilitative Studies and over 25 years of experience in a variety of human service settings in both public and private organizations. He has been in his current role at Vocational Rehabilitation for 11 years. He also serves as the point of contact for the division for veteran referrals to and from the VA Vocational Rehabilitation Program.

Sandy Moonert, North Carolina Program Director for Enable America, brings over 20 years business experience to the mission of connecting wounded warriors, disabled veterans, and individuals with disabilities to employment opportunities. She has served over 500 North Carolinians with disabilities by managing Enable America action-based programs with over 40 employers and 200 employee mentors; organizing Job Seeker Workshops recruiting volunteer presenters from business and disability communities; and connecting with more than 50 veteran and social service agencies and colleges and universities.
